I enjoyed a wonderful time visiting my niece Rachel and my nephews Matthew, Michael and David last weekend. First stop was College Park, Maryland, where Rachel is in her freshman year studying to be a journalist. Then we traveled onto New Jersey where we visited my brother and watched the exciting super bowl victory of our team! It was a great time. Rachel shared with me that she had written some articles for the college newspaper and is enjoying recognition for her writing ability. I read them and noticed that when she writes she always includes her gratitude for the teachers in her life: those in the classroom and those in her life experience, for example, her parents, siblings and friends. I am very proud of her because at the young age of eighteen she already knows the value of learning from family, from good friends, and from the community. She knows at a young age that passing on faith and the example of good words is needed for happiness and for finding one's place in the world. Jesus affirms this in today's Gospel where He says that *"whoever obeys and teaches these commandments will be called greatest in the kingdom of heaven"* (Matthew 5:19). We as Christians really do not realize that we are all teachers of one another. We pass on our faith by our good example and good words in service to our neighbor. Actions and words are the tools that God has given us to build up his kingdom. When our actions and words are hurtful, then we hurt God's cause in the world by hurting others. My niece Rachel believes that through her positive words she can help make the world a better place. I remember reading a reflection from Fr. Ron Rolheiser, a spiritual director, who said in his article that we spend way too much time worrying about the 6th commandment: *"Thou shalt not commit adultery."* Many Christians believe that the only real sins are actions that involve weaknesses of the flesh, as did the Pharisees in today's Gospel. But Fr. Ron challenges that when he writes that a worse sin is violation of the 5th commandment: *"Thou shalt not kill."* He says that Jesus meant not only physically killing the body, but "killing the soul" of another person through means words and spreading calumny and detraction. So let's watch our words and see how many times we can use words that build up others rather than tear down. ~ Fr. John
