

### Laetare Sunday

This Sunday is called "Laetare" Sunday. Laetare means "rejoice!" We rejoice because we are half-way through lent, and closer to Easter Sunday. We rejoice because we have been faithful in denying ourselves something



for God and have been successful; we rejoice because even if we haven't been successful we know that God loves us anyway - so we can laugh a bit at ourselves as we echo our favorite sports team: "Maybe next year!"; we rejoice because spring is here; we rejoice because the days are getting longer. If we have trouble feeling a sense of joy because of some challenge in our life, today's scripture directs us to ask God for what we need: eyes of wonder! In today's Gospel, Jesus heals the man born blind from birth. Nobody will believe that he is really healed, even his parents have doubts. But what does he care what other people think. He has experienced Jesus Christ personally and so his faith in Jesus leads him into a deeper relationship with him. He almost doesn't even care about his physical sight as much as he cares for belief in Jesus. Faith has given him new eyes: eyes of wonder. And so Jesus rewards his faith with not only physical sight, but also with eyes of wonder. With this new spiritual sight, the blind man now cured will see all of life with amazement! What a gift from God. We don't know what happened to him after his encounter with Jesus ended, but we can be sure that he never closed his newly opened eyes of his heart to wonder unfolding around him. Now he would understand Rabbi Abraham Joshua Herschel who said: "Our goal should be to live life in radical amazement...get up in the morning and look at the world in a way that takes nothing for granted...to be spiritual is to be amazed." When we believe in Jesus, our problems aren't even that worrisome anymore to us; they almost don't matter. For we now only want more closeness to Jesus, so that we can see life as he does: with amazement! So let this 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of lent, Laetare Sunday, prompt you and I to rejoice in the amazing gifts of life, family, and the beauty around us in nature and in people!
