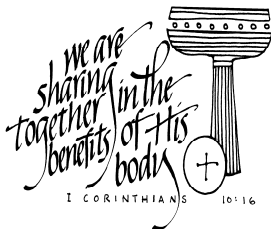

I always admired the missionaries who would tell stories of how they survived the most primitive conditions. Given there was no refrigeration, they had to find a way to keep food that would last and not spoil. By learning from poor people they lived with, they would dig deeply into the ground to locate where the frozen winter earth was still well below the freezing point, even though the warmth of spring had already arrived above ground. There deep in the still-frozen soil, they would store their meats, eggs, butter and other foods. This was their "refrigeration." Without it the foods would not last and they could not survive. Today we celebrate the feast of spiritual food that does last, the Most Holy Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ: Corpus Christi. Quite honestly, without taking in this sacred food we would not be able to survive on our spiritual journey. Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta said that "Jesus made himself the bread of life to satisfy my hunger for Him, and He has also made Himself the hungry one so that I may satisfy His love for me." We know from our own family life and cultures that food is often connected with love and community. Corpus Christi is a feast that reminds us of our great hunger for God, and how the spiritual food we know as the Eucharist is the only way we can fill that spiritual hunger. One time a man who was not Catholic was wondering what the Eucharist was all about. When he was told that it is God made flesh, through the body of Christ, he answered: "Wow! I wonder if you Catholics realize how lucky you are; that you have God right at the tip of your tongues!" Isn't that the truth! If we really believe who it is that we are receiving in the Eucharist, we would bow down with greater humility, and thank God for His gift to us of His life! Today is also Father's Day here in our country. Let us receive the Body & Blood of Christ in honor of our earthly fathers, as a way to thank our heavenly Father for His gift of love and mercy. ~ Fr. 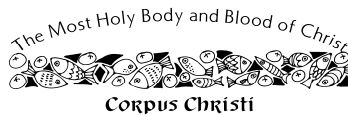
