Who's the "go-to" person in your life? We all tend to search out for that special person we can rely on when we need something that is very important to us. For example, a wife expects her husband to step in and help her with family chores and challenges when family life becomes intense. He becomes her "go-to" person.

The go-to person may be a good friend, a teacher, or a trustworthy person one can rely on no matter what. Yet there are deep spiritual needs and questions that arise in our lives that the only go-to person who can help is God! Jesus is saying that in today's Gospel when He says to the apostles: "Whoever loves their father or mother, son or daughter, more than me is not worthy of me." What He means by this is not that we shouldn't love our parents and family greatly, but we have to be wise enough to know when to go to God first and primarily; for there are certain times only God's love and guidance can help us! What are those certain times, those unique human moments at which only God's love and guidance sustain us? They are times of significant change in our lives (e.g., moving, losing a loved one, health challenges, changing careers). There are also happy times that bring significant change: marriage, graduation, anniversaries, and promotions! During these times of change or transition, certainly our loved ones can help us; but only Jesus can walk us through them. Because He understands the power of sacrifice, and how difficult it can be for us humans to die to our old ways of living and embrace the new ways. Jesus describes this in today's Gospel as a willingness to "take up our cross" and follow after Him. He can show us the way to practice sacrificial love, to live now for others. I have just returned from performing my niece's wedding last week. At the end of the homily I encouraged her and her new husband to accept the invitation of Jesus into their marriage: "I no longer call you slaves, but my friends!" When we make Jesus our go-to friend in life, everything else falls into place. We feel peace, great joy, and never become rattled by change or uncertainty in our lives. Because we are sure that we have a great friend in Jesus!
