OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Today's feast of Christ the King is always one that brings hope and relief for many of us. It is the last Sunday of the church's liturgical year as we begin our new year next week with Advent. So on this last Sunday we can pause PASTOR and take stock of how we have done this past year, and



what the new year ahead holds for us. But first we might ask the question, how can we as God's people measure our progress for the past year? The 1st reading from the prophet Ezekiel provides us with a measuring stick. It is God's measuring stick: "The lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, the sick I will heal..." Through the prophet God is giving us a very definite direction as to what our work is in this world. To help us be more intentional in fulfilling God's work, Jesus tells us specifically how we are to imitate Christ our King: "Feed the hungry, clothe the naked, visit the sick and imprisoned, welcome the stranger...." To give you a personal witness on how I attempted to put Jesus' teaching into practice in my own life I will share an experience from early on in my ministry. There was a priest-chaplain giving a group of young priests a retreat which I had attended. I was kind of taken aback when he told us that priests and religious often would neglect visiting hospitals or prisons because they would feel uncomfortable in those environments. Avoiding those places would be neglecting these human souls who desperately needed God. That bothered me very much. An uneasy feeling stayed with me, so I felt moved to get more involved in visiting the psychiatric hospital near my parish. I really loved it! Not long after my friend Sr. Jeanette, who was the Chaplain at a women's' prison needed a priest to say Mass at the prison, so I also got more involved in prison ministry. My point is when I began to encounter these human beings who so desperately needed Jesus; I received a gift from them! I realized how desperately I needed Jesus as well. They gave me the courage and the hope to admit my need and not let shame or guilt have the final word in our lives! I invite each one of us to make Christ the King the center of our hearts, to heal our brokenness and rule our thoughts and actions as we enter into this amazing feast!!! ~ Fr. John
