As I am reflecting on this Holy Week, I am struck by the deep level of <u>prayerfulness</u> I experience among our parishioners. Let me share some personal experiences. During the consecration at Mass, for example, I always sense your deep silence as a sign of your reverence for Jesus in the Eucharist. Also, each day as I notice the s

Also, each day as I notice the steady flow of cars bringing you to our Adoration Chapel to spend some time in quiet prayer with the Lord, I feel comforted for all of us and for the people for whom we pray. Finally I find myself also admiring the great love and perseverance of you, our Food Pantry volunteers, by your patience and devotion in serving Jesus among the poor and homeless. All of these and many more daily experiences of your faith and spirituality remind me of today's Gospel, where the followers of Jesus found the empty tomb after Jesus was buried. They were bewildered at first by how the heavy stone (boulder) blocking Jesus' tomb could have been rolled back – for it was impossible for any human beings to push it aside. It was apparent that Jesus' promise to rise from the dead was actually true!!! He was Risen, Alleluia!! But now the deeper lesson they had to learn was that the stone was rolled back not so Jesus could get out, but so that they could get in and be assured that His tomb of death would remain empty forever. And they learned this through their prayerfulness! So my dear parishioners, if you find that you have any "large boulders" in your heart, preventing you from escaping fear, resentment, despair or depression, do not lose hope!! Through your prayers, allow the Risen Jesus to roll back these boulders to invite you into meeting Him once again: for He now resides in your heart!! He has given us the promise of life eternal, and will walk with us each day to guide and sustain us through life's journey.

I want to wish all of you a most Happy Easter, ask for your prayers, and let you know that I pray for each one of you every single day!!!


