I had what I call a "Pentecost experience" a few years ago. I was visiting a good friend of mine who is a Methodist minister. He took me over to see his church, at which time I also met some of his parishioners who were wearing badges describing their ministries. Here is how he introduced them: "This is Mrs. Jones, whose ministry is bread-making for the mass." "This is Mr. Johnson, whose ministry is taking care of the grounds." "And meet Mrs. Harrison, whose ministry is praying for the sick." They all proudly wore their badges. I asked him about his use of the word "ministry" for all these different people, to which he responded: "We believe that God gives us all a ministry! And that is why we all wear badges naming our ministry when we come to church!" I was very impressed with this practice and wondered why we in the Catholic Church do not do the same? After all, when we are baptized and confirmed we all receive the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit. In today's 2nd reading St. Paul reminds us that "in the Holy Spirit there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different ministries but the same God who produces all of them in everyone." Why is it in our church we mostly think of the priest as the main one doing ministry? Our faith teaches that all of us share in Christ's ministry, each of us having a different function or job to do. I always value when a parishioner says to me: "God bless you, Father!" I feel blessed by their ministry of prayer and blessing. We have to remember that through our baptism we all have the power to bless each other. I can better understand why St. Francis of Assisi did not choose to be a priest although he always respected the priesthood for providing us the Eucharist. You see, St. Francis did not want to be seen as being higher than other Catholics; that could endanger the virtue of humility. St. Paul continues that we are "one body which has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many are one body, so also Christ." In other words, we are Christ's body and so each of us needs to do our ministry! As we celebrate the feast of Pentecost, let each of us ask the Holy Spirit what is our role that is needed to build the body of Christ! And let's believe it!! ~ Fr. John

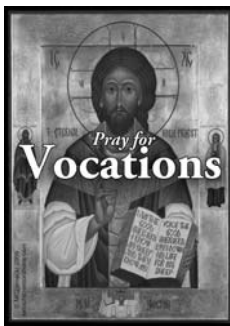
