On this feast of our parish, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we take time to thank God for His great gift of spiritual food that strengthens and nourishes us. We are also grateful that our parish name, **Blessed Sacrament**, is a special gift for us; because the Body & Blood Of Christ, housed in the Blessed Sacrament, is the feast of spiritual food that lasts. We know through experience that so much of our daily food does not last. It either spoils very fast or we throw it away without thinking of others who have little food. This feast challenges us to be generous to the poor and hungry who are starving because of little food or resources to obtain food. Quite honestly, without receiving the Eucharist we would not be able to survive on our spiritual journey. St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta said that *"Jesus made himself the bread of life to satisfy my hunger for Him, and He has also made Himself the hungry one so that I may satisfy His love for me."* We know from our own family life and cultures that food is often connected with love and community. Our feast today is a reminder of our great hunger for God, and how the spiritual food we know as the Eucharist is the only way we can fill that spiritual hunger. One time a man who was not Catholic, was wondering what the Eucharist was all about. Then he saw people going to receive Holy Communion. When he was told that the Eucharist is God made real in the flesh through the body of Christ, he answered: "Wow! I wonder if you Catholics realize how lucky you are! You have God right on the tip of your tongues!" Isn't that the truth! If we really believe who it is that we are receiving in the Eucharist, we would first make sure we would receive it at every Mass. We would bow down with greater humility, and thank God for His gift to us, for the Bread of Life. ~ Fr. John

Summer is almost here! Weddings, Graduations, vacations and other activities can make it hard to attend Mass here. With electronic offerings, you can ensure your parish still receives your offering that we depend on to run the parish. Now you can use your credit card or electronic check to support the mission of Blessed

Sacrament. Using electronic giving is easy to do. Visit our website www.blessedsacramentnh.org and click on the Giving button. In a few minutes you can be sure that your gift will work every day of the year to help our parish.

Frequently asked questions

Q.: Is Online Giving Safe?

A: Online Giving meets the highest banking-level security standards set forth by the Payment Card Industry (PCI) to ensure safe and confidential transactions. In fact, your banking information is encrypted in the system and is not accessible to any users or administrators of the Online Giving system. When you manage your own account information, your church never needs to handle checks or worry about locking up documents containing your account information. And you'll always be certain that your gifts are direct-deposited into your church's account.

Q: What are the advantages of Online Giving?

A: It makes it easy to give, even when you are unable to attend church. You never have to bring cash or checks to church. Giving electronically also helps the church save money and plan its budget!

Q: What do I do at collection time? It feels awkward not to have an envelope to put in the basket.

A: "I Gave Online" cards are available on the table in the back of the church to place in the collection basket.
