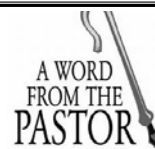

A HOME FILLED WITH STRIFE and DIVISION DESTROYS ITSELF Mark 3:25



My brother and I were driving together one time to visit his son AJ who was at a hockey camp. This camp was quite a distance from where we started so we followed the car directions (pre GPS days) thinking we were going the right way. It just so happened that when we got off the highway, we went east when we should have gone west. Needless to say, 3 hours later when we realized the error, we were not too happy that we went in the wrong direction. Life is a lot like traveling a long journey. As we are travelling, we encounter new roads, detours, and all sorts of re-routes that we really need to pay attention to, or else we can get lost. Isn't this what happened to Adam & Eve in today's first reading from the book of Genesis. Our parents got "lost" when they ate the forbidden fruit, which God directed them not to eat. But they did the exact opposite! Thus they started off in the wrong direction with God, even hiding themselves so they wouldn't have to face God for their error. God begins to look for them by asking them a very important question: "Where are you?" God knew their error already, so you would think that God was going to come down hard on them for their sin of disobedience. Instead God asks a very helpful question to help them learn from their mistake: it is a question of discernment! The "Where are you?" that God posed to them was an opportunity for them to take stock of where they were starting off their life's journey. Were they starting off in the right direction, with a trusting and humble spirit, seeking to follow God's plan for them? Or did the serpent's (the devil's) promise to give them the same power, knowledge and wisdom of God if they ate the fruit cloud their minds? As a result, they chose not to discern God's plan for them and their role in helping God start the human family. In other words, they didn't know where they were starting from! There was no discernment! In today's Gospel, Jesus very strongly reminds even His own family: if you want to start life off on the right foot, discern God's will for your life! Then you will never get lost; you will never go in the wrong direction! A good lesson for all of us wouldn't you say?
