

Have you heard the expression "fake it till you make it?" The idea is to act as if you feel a certain way until you actually do. For example, a new ath-



lete joining a professional team just after graduating college often feels like he has not arrived yet as a professional player. But now he is under contract and has to act as if he has all the abilities that are needed to be a pro. He hopes and trusts that by imitating the qualities he wants to have, especially self-confidence, eventually those traits will be achieved. It's a handy tool, but I believe there is a better one: "Faith it till you make it." Rather than relying on one's acting ability by behaving as an impostor, we simply trust Jesus with whatever circumstances or difficulties come our way. In today's second reading from Corinthians, St. Paul is encouraging the new believers to act as if the things that are their main concerns in the moment are not that important. At first, it sounds as if he is saying "fake it until you make it." But he is trying to help them move beyond their day to day worries and concerns to a broader perspective: from God's viewpoint of eternal life. In short, St. Paul is really saying: "Faith it till you make it." In other words, when we try to love another person whom we may find unlovable in our life, we may feel like we are pretending, or are hypocritical. But if we seek to live the way Jesus teaches us, we believe that by imitating the quality of love and patience we wish we had, eventually those traits will be achieved. So next time you feel challenged to love another person, "Faith it till you make it." You and I are going to get there some day; it just takes practice and patience with ourselves and others! ~ Fr.
