The most decisive question we can ask ourselves is "Do I have a heart?" Many years ago, I was getting ready to leave a parish as I was being assigned to another ministry. After I said my good-byes to the people at my final Mass, one man came up to me before leaving Mass and said: "Thank you father; you really cared!" That was one of the greatest gifts I had every received. Knowing that I really cared for the people in that community gave me the assurance that I could answer the above question "Do I have a heart?" in a positive way. Let's face it, the most important thing we can do in life is to be in touch with the deep longings of our hearts. Because there in those deep longings, we can find Our Lord encouraging us to live authentically. We were made to love, and to serve, and to build community with the people around us. More than anything else, the human heart is where we are most ourselves. It is where we hold the secrets about ourselves and the hopes and dreams about what our lives can be. Isn't it true that we feel the most fulfilled in our lives by the acts of loving our family and neighbor? In today's Gospel we see the story of the poor widow who came to the temple to pray. When she went inside, she put into the treasury two small coins worth a few cents. Jesus noticed that she contributed all she had in those two cents, her whole livelihood. In comparison, many rich people put in large sums of money; yet it didn't hurt their pockets. The point of the story is that the poor widow had a heart; she gave from the deepest place in her heart. Which means she must have noticed the poor people in her life and that others had greater suffering than herself. I think that we need to follow the example of the poor widow. We need to live more from the deepest part of our hearts, which is the way God made us. Right now, we can see that many countries throughout the world are more concerned about how much is in their pockets rather than what's deepest in their hearts. Pope Francis has written an extremely important encyclical on the human and divine love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, 'Dilexit Nos' ("He loved us"). He offers a path to respond to God's invitation in our loveless world to bring love forward. Let us keep our eyes focused on the Sacred Heart of Jesus, who beckons to the deepest longings of our human hearts to care deeply for one another. ~ Fr. John
