

This weekend we celebrate the feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. In the old days, the feast was simply called "Christ



the King." I'm not guite sure why the title expanded to include the whole "Universe." I imagine there are a few possible reasons for this expansion of Jesus/ title. First, Our Church is called "Catholic," and catholic means universal. We are a Church that is interested in people from all over the universe, from many countries, ethnicities, and races. I am sure Christ would have it no other way. As the first reading from the Book of Daniel says: His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not be taken away. He wouldn't be king of just one country, or of one group of people. That would be too narrow a role and title for God. God created all people as His sons and daughters. Second, Jesus is called King of the Universe, because when we look around at the leaders in the world, most if not all, just want to govern their own country in the sense of keeping everything within their own borders. If there is an overflow or surplus of the world's goods, no country really wants to share this surplus with poorer peoples. We see the rising tide of nationalism growing dangerously throughout the world today. Finally, we forget the enormous power and extension of God's love throughout the universe. When you walk outside on a clear, crisp evening, you can see the moon and stars shining brightly from millions of miles away. All of nature cries out with joy of the Lord's light and love for us. Not even a mother's love, strong as it is, can come anywhere near the extensive love of God for His universe. There are probably other reasons why Jesus is called our King of the Universe. Let us be comforted in knowing that when we arise from sleep in the morning, or hunker down for rest at night, our Universal Savior joins us at our bedside to bless us and give us rest and protection. Next weekend we will begin the great season of Advent. That is our time of waiting and expectation for our Universal Savior to come again to save our world once more. We see in today's Gospel our Savior Jesus showing how powerful a King He is. Though in prison and in chains Our Lord showed Pilot who really was in charge: 'My kingdom does not belong to this world." God could easily destroy all the armies and kingdoms of this world, but chooses to love us instead! ~ Fr. John


