The theme for the readings today is persistence. Per- 🕰 🕬 📆 sistence is needed in many situations where we wish to accomplish something important. For example,



when we persist in studying a new language, unless we study each day for at least ten minutes, we will never learn it. I always wanted to learn Spanish ever since I was in the seminary years ago. However, I did not persist in studying each day, so it felt like I had to start repeatedly to get back on track. Finally, after many years of study, I have a pretty good grasp of the language. Looking back, I wish I had studied more faithfully over the years because I could have learned sooner. Today's scriptures apply this principle of persistence to our prayer life. In the first reading, the only way that the Israelites could defeat the more powerful enemy was if Moses persisted in keeping his hands raised in prayer during battle. When he got tired, he let his hands rest and the enemy started to win. However, Moses' friends Aaron and Hur helped support his uplifted hands by placing a rock for him to sit on. Then the battle changed, as Moses' persistence helped them win. The rock stands for persistence prayer. Isn't it true that when we persist in prayer good things can come about? Of course, we can get tired, but often we delay or even skip prayer out of discouragement, and we too need help to keep going. The secret is our faith. If we believe that God is listening to our prayers, then we can keep going. If we also believe that God will answer our prayers and even give us a better outcome than what we prayed for, then our persistence will have won out. I really admire the widow in today's Gospel who would not stop challenging the judge to render a decision for her so that she would be treated justly. The judge finally gives in because he sees how determined the widow is in receiving justice. God is much kinder than the judge in the Gospel, so we should always persist in asking our Father for what we need.

Our beautiful church is old. We are always in need of some type of repair. Unfortunately, the next one is a BIG one. We had our boiler serviced before the heating season began. We noticed it was leaking when not in use. It needs to be replaced. Not only that, but we also have to remove the old boiler and exhaust - which has asbestos. This will be a very costly venture. We've worked with the Diocese and had several companies give us quotes. Bishop Libasci has approved one of the estimates and the new boiler has been ordered. Regrettably, the new boiler won't be in for several weeks. We're hoping it will be installed by Thanksgiving if all goes well. For now, we're asking that you dress appropriately to come to Mass as the temperatures get chilly. If it becomes too cold in the church, we will move Masses to the church hall, which is on a separate forced hot-air system. We appreciate your patience during this time and know we are working with the contractor to get this resolved as soon as possible.
