Happy Father's Day. The words of Pope St. John Paul II in his letter All Baptized Christian Adults, the true meaning of Christian fatherhood: "Becoming Dad (and Mom) makes us more like God....all the baptized, even though in different ways, are called to be a Father or Mother." These words make a deep impression on all of us! We men especially must realize that we are called to embrace the role of "spiritual fatherhood." The Pope goes on to write that Satan tries very hard to destroy fatherhood by pitting spiritual fathers against their children! In our own country, we see this happening almost every day. Government leaders who are supposed to be like father figures to the people they serve, instead act selfishly. They even call people derogatory names. This can happen even with Church leaders who are supposed to show the love of Christ but become angry or abusive towards their people. Then there are the fathers of families who neglect their wives and children giving a poor example of fatherhood. What are we as spiritual fathers supposed to be doing according to God's Will? We must listen to the thoughts and emotions of those whom we serve; especially to the pain they might go through in their searching. It is not enough to advise them; we must also have affection for them. Spiritual fathers are badly needed in the world and in our Church today. These men would be men of courage to show love and compassion. They would be proud of practicing their faith, going to Mass, receiving Holy Communion and praying at Adoration. These are truly manly fathers. I remember one of my visits to our Franciscan missions in Guatemala. While the children came running up to me, calling me "Padre Sito," (little father), one little boy clasped my hand and wouldn't let go. We walked around the ball field, chatted with the group, and the little boy just quietly held onto my hand. I realized through this experience how much that child needed the love and presence of a father. I realized also how important for us Christian men that we see ourselves as spiritual fathers. We are not perfect, but God does not care about that. He wants us to share in the work of the Holy Trinity, and to bring people like that little fatherless boy into His love. We as fathers are called to change the patterns in our culture of sadness and confusion into those of hope and goodness. What do you say my fellow men? Will you join me in becoming a spiritual father to somebody in need? If you are willing, God will surely bring someone to you, just like He brought that little boy to me. ~ Fr. John

Thank you for supporting this fundraiser for our parish. It's a fun and easy way to help the parish. A new club will begin shortly.

How it works: Upon joining the club, you will receive a number. You pay \$1 each week for 20 weeks – to retain this number. You may pay weekly or pay in full (\$20).
