"Before the Lord the whole universe is as a grain from a balance or as a drop of morning dew come down upon the earth." (Wisdom 11:22)



When I think of our place in the universe, I think of the 6.5 billion people that live on this planet. I also think of the numerous new galaxies that astronomers are now discovering. Do you remember in school how we were taught that there were only 9 planets; do you remember their names? There are now more planets, galaxies, and stars that have been discovered beyond our wildest imagination. Do you ever wonder: "How do I fit into this vast panorama of creation?" "I am just one little person; God has so many things that He created to keep His eye on that surely He doesn't even know I'm around!" Yes the universe is vast, and we humans are tiny. Just look at our 1st Reading today in which the author compares each person to a grain or speck, and to a drop of dew. Doesn't it make you feel rather small; and maybe, we wonder, does God even notice me? Well if you pay attention to today's Gospel, Jesus who is God & man, very much notices someone quite small: Zacchaeus. The scripture says that Zacchaeus is not only small of stature (he needed to climb up a tree to see Jesus walking by); he is also small of heart. He doesn't have the ability to love anyone else other than himself. Talk about a speck of grain, or a drop of dew. If there was any human being that fit this category, it was Zacchaeus. And people all hated him because he was a tax collector and got wealthy at their expense. You would think Jesus might say to Himself: "Why bother with this character; he is so self-centered and unkind, let me go help someone more worthy." But Jesus does the opposite. Walking near the tree that Zacchaeus climbed, Jesus stopped and looked up and said: "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." Zacchaeus is shocked!! Jesus noticed him? You see what one look from Jesus can do to a person: make them change their heart. The new Zacchaeus now says: "I will give half of my possessions to the poor, and repay those who I have cheated 4 times over!" Wow, a conversion on the spot. This story shows us the power of Jesus to change a person's heart. Getting back to what I said at the beginning, the universe that God notices the most is inside the human heart. That inner space where love exists is what interests God more than any other galaxy. So next time you let Jesus really see into your heart watch out!! Believe me, your life will radically change as you realize that in God's eyes you are not very small at all!!

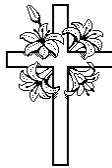
Winter Coat Drive
