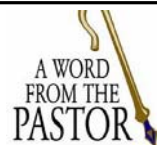
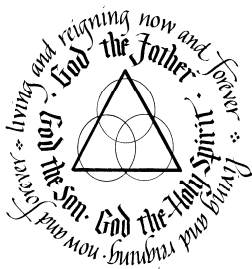

There was a little girl who had just come home from her religion class in which the teacher spoke about the Holy Trinity. She was still unclear about how the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit could be three persons yet one God! So she asked her mother to clarify what this mystery of faith meant. Her mother, a bit anxious and unsure, answered as best as she could. But once again, the little girl was still unclear. So she replied to her mother: "Thanks mom, but I think I'll look it up on the internet!" This weekend we are celebrating the foundation of our faith, the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. For centuries the great minds of the Church have been trying to explain what this mystery means by using images such as the 3-leaf clover; the family unit (father, mother, child); how 3 points make up one triangle; etc., etc. Let's face it; it is very difficult to try to understand or explain something that goes beyond the mind's capacity to understand. However, when we go to the Scriptures, we find a way that helps us understand" not our mind but through experience. In other words, we can only know the Trinity when we can move beyond ourselves and our own sense of "mine." When we can overcome our tendency to think of ourselves first and forget the other people in our lives. For the Trinity always lives in communion. So when we strive to live in communion with each other we imitate the Trinity. The Trinity is in a constant state of loving one another, and through that love we actually come into being. I even imagine that when I see a new-born baby, I think to myself: "There's the Trinity at work again: creating life through love!" When we become baptized, we are welcomed into this loving circle (or cycle) of God's continuous Love. That's why St. John says in his Gospel: "God IS love!" So our work in this world is to create life through our love! Just like the Trinity. There are so many ways we can do this. For example, we can offer to help the elderly do their shopping. I can remember how one of our parishioners said that when he is in the supermarket and notices elderly unable to reach up to the top shelves for food, he offers to assist them. When we do things such as these, in the most simple but powerful ways we are imitating the communion of the Trinity! To quote a famous poem: "When I looked for my God, my God I could not see; when I looked for myself, myself eluded me; when I saw my brother, I found all Three!" ~ Fr. John

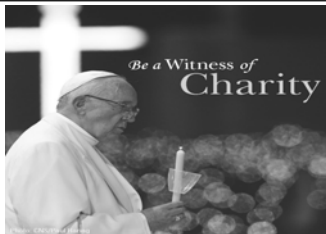
