I enjoy watching the History Channel on television. I especially admire people who whole-heartedly give themselves for a cause. This week we celebrate Independence Day in our country. There are many brave men and women to whom we owe gratitude for their sacrifice for freedom’s sake. They truly put themselves on the front line in order that we might enjoy our liberties. Isn’t it inspiring when a person gives themselves to a good cause whole-heartedly! The word means giving one’s total attention and energy to what they believe in. Giving one’s self fully. That is what true love and dedication are made of. And while we do give ourselves in such a way to things we love and believe in, I wonder how whole-hearted we are in giving ourselves to God? In today’s Scripture readings we hear of people who were called by God to give themselves to His work and message. He invites them to follow Him. But some have excuses: they want to take care of their families’ needs before they serve the Lord. Jesus wonders if such persons are fit for the kingdom of God. We ourselves often answer that the three most important things that matter to us in life are God, family and country. We say God first; but in reality, we put all other things before God. We need more examples like St. Thomas Moore, who was the chancellor under King Henry VIII. Henry separated from the Catholic Church to form his own church in England. He demanded that all his cabinet members swear an oath of loyalty to the king as being supreme instead of the Pope. Out of fear for their lives all of the cabinet members swore their oath to the king: except St. Thomas Moore. He was put into prison and sentenced to die. His daughter begged her father to swear the oath of loyalty to the king; and that he didn’t really have to believe it. But St. Thomas said “I die the king’s good servant, and God’s first!” He comforted his daughter to assure her that they would meet in heaven, then she would understand one day why he did what he did. How about us? Who do we honor and obey as the most important person in our life? Hopefully it is God, who gave us the most perfect freedom we could every have: the freedom of the children of God! Put God first in your life!!

### Frequently asked questions

#### Q.: Is Online Giving Safe?

**A:** Online Giving meets the highest banking-level security standards set forth by the Payment Card Industry (PCI) to ensure safe and confidential transactions. In fact, your banking information is encrypted in the system and is not accessible to any users or administrators of the Online Giving system. When you manage your own account information, your church never needs to handle checks or worry about locking up documents containing your account information. And you'll always be certain that your gifts are direct-deposited into your church's account.

#### Q: What are the advantages of Online Giving?

**A:** It makes it easy to give, even when you are unable to attend church. You never have to bring cash or checks to church. Giving electronically also helps the church save money and plan its budget!

**Q:** What do I do at collection time? It feels awkward not to have an envelope to put in the basket.

**A:** "I Gave Online" cards are available on the table in the back of the church to place in the collection basket.
