“Tell those who are well off with this world’s goods not to be proud and not to rely on so uncertain a thing as wealth. Let them trust in God who provides us richly with all things for our use. Charge them to do good works and to be generous, sharing what they have. (1 Timothy 6: 17-19)”



If we pay close attention to this teaching on the use of our wealth by St. Paul to Timothy, notice how he uses the word Charge them to share what they have. In other words, St. Paul means that we are under an obligation, a charge to share our wealth with those in need. As Catholics we often do not grasp the power of this teaching for our eternal salvation. Most of us grew up in an environment which made it seem that being “generous” to others meant giving from our “surplus;” that is, what was left over for us. Thus we would be making a “donation.” And so we got into using words like being charitable, donating our monies, or spreading around our wealth. While these words are admirable, they made us think that real generosity was only giving our “left overs.” Yet the Bible teaches us that we actually have to go deeper. We must realize that sharing our wealth is a serious obligation. Do you remember how as Catholic children we began to learn this lesson when the Church gave us mite boxes that we were to fill with our coins? We were learning that it was our obligation to assist poor people and support our church. At an early age, we were beginning to understand what Jesus taught us in “The Great Commandment” in Matthew 25: 31-46: “I assure you, as often as you aid one of your least brothers/sisters, you did it to me. And as often as you neglected to do it to one of these least ones, you neglected to do it to me.” But then later as adults as we experienced economic boons in our world we lost sight of our obligation to help one another and especially the poor. My dear brothers and sisters, as I present to you our Fiscal Year Report this weekend, I want to thank you for your generosity to our parish. You are very good in sharing your time, talent and treasure in helping to maintain and develop our programs and buildings. But as you can see from the insert, each year we are faced with a parish deficit. Truthfully we have to face this and work to build up our funds. I am suggesting that everyone increase their weekly offering by about \$3.00 or \$4.00 dollars a week. I suspect that you will never miss it and I’m sure it will come back to you in some form or other. The Lord is not going to let any of us outdo Him in generosity. I’ve always experienced that. If you can do better than 3 or 4 dollars it will be very helpful, because not everyone will be able to make an increase of any kind. I want to end on two positive thoughts: our parish buildings, though old, are being maintained and are in good shape. Also, there are new people joining our parish every week. They say how much they love this church as soon as they walk inside its doors, and they feel the warmth that emanates from you. If we all do our part in supporting our parish we can be sure that the Lord will continue to bless us. Please be generous, and trust that the Lord will bless you/us in manifold ways that you can’t imagine!!!

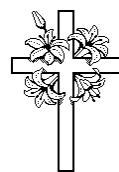

Coats may be brought to the office during regular business hours or left in the back of the church, marked as a donation. Thank

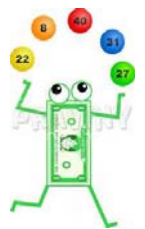
